The School

Established in 1637, Sandwich, Massachusetts is the oldest town on Cape Cod possessing the quintessential New England charm surrounded by beautiful walking and biking trails, bird sanctuaries, saltwater estuaries, freshwater ponds, and the seashore. Sandwich is located in the northwest corner of Cape Cod, 68 miles south of Boston, MA, and 61 miles from Providence, RI. Sandwich High School is a comprehensive four-year public high school enrolling 660 students in grades 9 through 12. Sandwich High School is accredited by the New England Association for Colleges and holds membership in the College Board and the National Association of College Admission Counseling. Sandwich High School has a rich history of supporting the interests of students from technology to the arts to prepare them for a fulfilling and successful future.

The Academic Program

Organized on a rotating 7 drop 1 schedule, seven (7) credits per year is the maximum course load. Students take 51-minute year-long courses or a combination of 51-minute semester-long (.5 credit) courses. Report cards are issued quarterly.

*****Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the 2020-2021 school year ran as a hybrid model. Students were divided into two cohorts. They attended in person for two days and virtually for two days. The fifth day consisted of asynchronous learning. A number of students were fully remote through April 2021 due to the pandemic.***

Successful completion of 26 credits is required for graduation. They must include:

The Grading System

Class rank is cumulative and based on a weighted GPA. Grades are weighted according to the course level in which the grade was earned. GPA is weighted and reported on a 4.0 scale.

The minimum passing grade is 60.

The weight of each course is based on the level; the calculation is done with the following percentages:

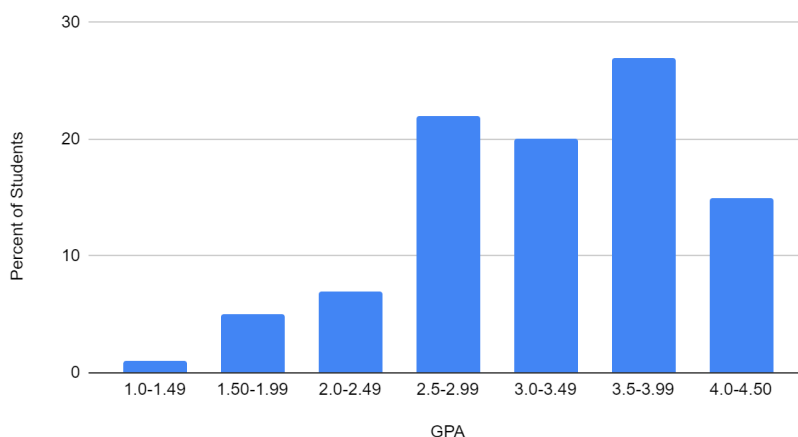
